



- Ezekiel 36.24-28 God will restore the exils in Babylon to Palestine, and purify the nation with a new heart and spirit. God's Spirit will replace their stony hearts.
- John 17.20-26 Jesus prays for all who will come to trust him as a result of the first followers' witness to him. He wants us all to be united in him. Then the world will believe that God sent him. Our relationship with Christ unites us with God and will enable us to know God's love.

Acts 2.1-21 50 days after Easter the Spirit fires the disciples, who

- speak in tongues. People think they are drunk but Peter explains the fulfilment of Scripture (Joel 2.28-32). Romans 8.14-17 Paul says those led by the Spirit are children of God. We pray 'Abba, Father'. If we suffer with him we will also be glorified with him in God's future.
- John 14.8-17 (25-27 may be added) Jesus explains that those who have seen him have seen the Father (as he is the revelation of God and we trust that). If we love him we will keep his commands and God's Spirit will be in us.

Galatians 5.1 and 13-25 We are called to freedom (not self- indulgence). The law is summarized as love – the fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Luke 9.51-62 Jesus sets out on his jojurney to Jerusalem to be raised on a cross and to heaven. Some Samaritans fail to welcome him but are forgiven. Would-be disciples are warned of the cost of commitment.
