
## Sandford-on-Thames

## **Parish Council meetings**

Sandford-on-Thames Parish Council meets on the first Monday of each month at 6.30 pm, unless it is a bank holiday, and residents are welcome to attend.

#### St Andrew's church

The parish church of St Andrew, in Church Road, has been at the heart of the village for over nine hundred years. We meet for worship every Sunday, and our ground source heat pump provides a warm building, open seven days a week, and the opportunity to use the church more widely for concerts, meetings and other events.

The churchyard and Garden of Remembrance are also open to all as a peaceful and beautiful place for reflection and prayer.

We celebrate a parish communion each Sunday at 10.00 - once a month the Westward Communion is less formal. There is also a BCP Communion service at 11.00 each Wednesday. The Sunday Club (Childrens' Church) is at 10.00 in the Harris Room next to the church – just come along any Sunday. Evening prayer is said (or on special occasions sung) every Sunday at 6.30 p.m.

## St Andrew's choir

The choir meets to practice every Wednesday at 7.30 in church. All who enjoy singing are welcome to join us between 7.30 and 8.10. ## Talking Shop: Sandford's Community Shop and Café

in the Village Hall
Open Monday to Friday 9.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
and Saturday 9.00 a.m. to 12 midday

Talking Shop is run by the community, for the community, with any surplus profit fed back into the project or spent for local benefit.



The shop stocks fresh fruit & veg, bread, eggs, meat, dairy, gifts, cards, daily newspapers, wines and beers, household stuff and more – selling local produce when possible

There is a weekday daily menu of delicious lunches, snacks, homemade cakes and barista coffees, in a bright airy space, with wifi, parking for cars and bikes, and a lovely garden with a gate straight into the playground.

On Saturdays the Market has guest stalls, and the café serves its famous bacon and egg baps.

Talking Shop can provide catering for events in the Village Hall: from coffee and pastries for your meeting, to lunches, dinners and parties.

## **Volunteering at Talking Shop**

Talking Shop depends on volunteers to staff the shop and café. Volunteering offers a great opportunity to meet more people, learn new skills and revive old ones, while helping to support a much loved and valued community resource.

**Knit and Stitch** Mondays 10.00 – 12.00. Just drop in.


## **Gardening Club**

## **Village Hall**

Our beautiful and recently renovated Village Hall is at the centre of the village and of village life. It is home to Talking Shop and café, the Saturday Market, and many other village events. There are two upstairs meeting rooms and a large hall, all available to hire with a preferential rate for Sandford residents.

The Hall is run by a management committee which welcomes new members as vacancies occur.

#### **Communications**

The Link parish magazine comes out quarterly (March, June, September, December) and is delivered free in the village or available from Talking Shop. Any submissions welcomed by the editor at robert.morgan@theology.ox.ac.uk.

The Parish Council noticeboards situated at the corner of Church Road and Henley Road, and at the beginning of Heyford Hill Lane, display information about forthcoming events and Parish Council news.

Talking Shop produces regular leaflets which are distributed throughout the village with information about the café, shop and market, and news of forthcoming events and activities.

#### **Buses**

As at July 2023 Sandford is served by the 3A to the city centre (see Oxford Bus company for timetable); the 45 goes to Cowley Centre (Thames Travel), and the X40/NX40 go to the city centre, and out to Wallingford and Reading (Oxford Bus Company) but only stop at Sandford in the later evening – before that they go to Sainsbury.

## **Heyford Meadow**

Heyford Meadow is an award-winning nature reserve, accessed from Broadhurst Gardens. It was created a few years ago, with the help of local volunteers, by the Oxford Preservation Trust, who restored the derelict site into a beautiful place filled with wild flowers and butterflies, and a remarkable number of different species of birds and other wildlife. There is still work for volunteers, and anyone interested should contact OPT via www.oxfordpreservation.org.uk.

#### Some walks around Sandford:

**Shakespeare's Way** is a long-distance footpath between Stratford-upon-Avon and London. Coming up the towpath from Oxford it crosses the river at the lock to Sandford, follows Church Road and Henley Road, turns left towards Grenoble Road and then sharp right at the far side of Oxford Park Homes and into open country. As far as London if you are that way inclined.

## The Towpath

Can get a bit muddy in winter but is always a pleasant walk, with birds and wildlife. Go on the Thames Path south towards Abingdon (or as far as London) or north towards Oxford (and the source of the Thames) - see http://www.thames-path.org.uk/thames\_abingdon\_oxford.html.

#### **Toot Baldon**

One footpath at the very end of Church Road and another past the church on the left as you go towards the lock, across Tinshed Hill - both lead to Lower Farm Lane, and the footpath that crosses the A4074 and leads you to the Baldons.

## **Sandford Lane**

Across the lock and up Sandford Lane towards Kennington and then up to Bagley bluebell woods.
